team, Mr. Lawrence and year-level teams for being overly responsive to the technological needs of our students and colleagues. Without your support, we could not sustain the robust remote learning strategy that we have in place.

On Monday, July 26th, 2021, S3 students who applied to become Prefects participated in a Prefect Leadership Forum held in the Staff Room of The Berkeley Institute. Thirty-five Prefect applicants engaged in a forum that included peer mentoring, group work, and an oral presentation. Leadership Committee members, including the administrative team, facilitated the initiative and deliberated after the session to confirm the number of successful applicants for provisional leadership positions. The applicants were organized into groups of five hopefuls and given one of the following scenarios to problem solve: cyberbullying, inappropriate bus behavior, gambling, illegal weapons on campus, self-harm, reckless riding, drug usage on campus, de-escalation of fights, and alcohol usage in school. Prefects are often challenged decision-making with when confronted with the aforementioned scenarios while on duty or in social arenas. Rather than telling the applicants how to deal with the aforesaid scenarios, the aspirants relied on their own values and belief systems to conjure decision making models for the scenarios provided. Shepherds lead from behind, staying behind the flock while letting the most nimble go out ahead; whereupon, the others follow, not realizing that all along they are being directed from behind. This blueprint for leadership is polar opposite to the traditional top-down management hierarchy. The Prefect applicants across the various teams were encouraged to express ideas, thereby fostering a quick and nimble type of problem solving pipeline. behalf of the Leadership Committee and the administrative team, I wish to congratulate the aspiring Prefects for providing frameworks to haunting issues that will take root and bloom.
